Scope. Since 2001, trial judges have been evaluated at least once every three years for the purpose of self-improvement.

Commission. N/A

Criteria. Criteria include patience and attentiveness, preparedness, temperament, clarity of written and oral decisions, administrative capacity, control over the courtroom, legal knowledge, and fairness and impartiality.

Data collection. Surveys are sent to attorneys who appeared before the judge in the previous two years, all court employees, and jurors. Attorney surveys are almost exclusively administered electronically.
